Sir,

With reference to your predecessor's despatch No. 1705 of the 7th December, 1923, on the subject of the proposed exchange of land with the East African Estates Limited I have the honour to inform you that as indicated in paragraph 8 of my despatch No. 1459 of December 21st, 1923, that Company's legal representative, Lieutenant Colonel Tucker, has during the past three months discussed fully with the Commandant of Lands the details of a final settlement between the Government and the Company. They have now arrived at a complete agreement, and as a result the Commandant of Lands has submitted detailed proposals which I, with the concurrence of the Resident Commissioner, have approved and put up to you for your recommendation to you, and, I trust, a satisfactory final settlement will be arrived at.

(a) Three areas of land amounting to 102,576 acres are to be relinquished by the Company.

(b) 91,500 acres between Lake Naivasha and Nakuru, 10,000 acres being the right bank of the Nakuru River, 1,000 acres being the left bank of the Nakuru River, and 1,000 acres being the right bank of the River Kerio.

Sir,

With reference to your predecessor's cablegram dated the 7th December, 1923, on the subject of the proposed exchange of land with the South African Estates Limited, I have the honour to inform you that as indicated in paragraph 2 of my despatch to you of December 11th, 1923, that Company's final agreement with Lieutenant Colonel Tucker has during the past three months stood in fully with the conditions of lands to which the final entitlement between the Government and the Company may be referred.

As they were now agreed upon by the parties, as a result the Company offered which was submitted to the proposals which I, with the agreement of the Government, have approved as being acceptable for exchange. You will see, and, I trust, acceptably, the following principal points:

(a) These proposals will consist of:

- (a) 180,000 acres in the area of Mombasa, Pavata to be relinquished by the Company.

- (b) 91,500 acres between Mombasa and Nairobi in the mire area of the Taita River, to be exchanged for 19,404 acres in the area of the Taita River.

(c) Lands in the Highlands to be granted to the Company as shown marked A,B,C and D in the attached plans.

Block A: comprises 5,000 acres of coffee land and 3,357 acres of maize-land near Kitale.

Block B: 6,293 of maize-land near the North Kavirondo border.

Block C: 1191 acres of maize-land in the Kibigori Uplands.

Block D: 4092 acres of dry maize-land in the Kibigori plain.

This latter Block is situated in an area within which inter-
transfer, irrespective of race has always been permitted, and
present landholders there are composed of members of both
communities, European and Asiatic. It has further been
surveyed for some 15 years without eliciting any application
for alienation to an Indian. The total area of these up-
country farms is, as will appear, to be 19,843 acres.

I am advised that a reasonable comparison of the values
of these areas is as follows:-

(e) As regards the several areas to be retained, it is proposed to modify the conditions of the existing leases so as to provide for the increase in acreage mentioned in the rent schedule in due course, required in future by way of proportionate reduction in the first five years, and thereafter to 3357 acres in respect

Part 1 and 2 of the first Schedule. I desire to draw particular attention to the fact that no modification of clause 8 of the lease is proposed: this clause enables the Government to take land required for Government purposes without compensation except for improvements. In view of this fact I see no objection to granting ferry rights at Bixoni (with the necessary entry) and reasonable facilities for the use of the present landing place on the Island side of the strait. The terms in which such rights are granted should of course be so expressed as to safeguard Government's foreshore rights.

(f) Further special provisions in respect of foreshore rights should also be made as follows: Concession of the Bixoni land within 100 feet of the foreshore should be limited without Government's consent, while for the rest of the coastal concession a 100 feet strip above high-water mark should be definitely reserved to Government.

(g) The present Government contract for coal for the quarrying of coal in the Lukut fields should remain and not be altered. It should however be limited in the event of a renewal of the contract before the expiry of that contract.

(h) The area at present reserved is a government rifle range at Bixoni. It is suggested that the government area be reduced to 1000 acres and the remainder 2800 acres be available for the use of Police and Staff Officers.

Range whilst I consider the site of the Ortingburgh Range whilst convenient for the use of the Police and Staff Officers, I am not prepared to do away with it. I would however allow other arrangements being made. The Government of Police and Staff Officers to the Officer Commanding.

(i) Survey fees to be payable at amount of £100 per acre that this is not a suitable site for a rifle range.

(j) Survey fees to be payable at amount of £100 per acre.

in proportion to the area taken up viz £6000 only instead of £9000 (See paragraph 3 of my despatch No. 1859 of 21st December 1923.)

(j) No refund to be made in respect of the Taveta area since the costs were paid to Non-Government Surveyors: when however, and if, Government alienates any of the land relinquished to other parties and collects survey fees, a refund to the East African Estates might then be considered.

(k) It is not proposed to charge survey fees for the Highland areas. (These fees as I informed you in my telegram No. 361 of November 29th will amount to £300, but in view of the large survey fees to be paid as in (i) above it is considered that the survey of the Highland areas should be free.)

(l) As regards stamp and registration fees, it is agreed that where the Company has already paid such fees in respect of the Coastal and Taveta areas, fees should not be charged again on the decreased areas retained by them. All titles issued for new areas will however be subject to such charges.

(m) Leases for the Highland areas will be granted in the usual form and subject to the usual conditions and privileges of agricultural leases under the Crown Lands Ordinance.

(n) See paragraph 2 of my despatch No. 1859 of December 1915 (See paragraph 2 of my despatch No. 1859 of December 21st, 1923.)

4. I believe these proposals to be reasonable and would point out that whereas some 20,000 acres in the Highland areas already open for alienation will be granted to the Company, a very large area will be gained for cultivation at the Coast, which will be available irrespective of any racial restrictions, in a region where it is very desirable to encourage production.

5. I trust that you will approve of the offer of these terms to the East African Estates Limited and shall be glad
