Pension Papers. Confidential of the 1st March, 1924, regarding the pensionable service of Mr. V. M. Joshi, 1st Grade Clerk, Land Department, I have the honour to transmit herewith a Form of Particulars required for the computation of pension payable to Mr. Joshi.

2. Mr. Joshi's services date from the 26th June, 1905/ and, after deducting ~~the~~ leave without pay, he becomes eligible for a pension in respect of 19 completed years service. The pension is computed at Shs. 150/-/60 a year with effect from the 8th October, 1924/ inclusive.

3. Pending the receipt of your sanction to the pension recommended I have authorised the grant of an alimentary allowance to Mr. Joshi at the rate of Shs. 1500/- a year with effect from the date of retirement.

INSTRUCTIONS REFERRED TO ON PAGE 1.

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**If this Paper of Particulars and the Certificates connected with it  
be not sent in original, the copies must be duly attested.**

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**HEAD 1 or 2.—**In the case of an Officer serving on the West Coast of Africa whether he is a native of that Coast. (Colonial Regulations, § 430.)

**HEAD 3.—**State the description of Allowance for which the Applicant is receiving Compensation, Compassionate Allowance, or Gratuity, and its amount claiming an addition to their Pensions in respect of Professional fees should be stated, and a reference should be given to the authority.

**HEAD 5.—**If the service has been interrupted by one or more breaks, the years before or after the number of years and months, and the causes of break or breaks should be stated under heading 9.

**HEAD 6.—**If the Person retiring has been in receipt of the same Salary, or in the case of an Officer serving on the West Coast of Africa, the same Wages at that date should be inserted, preceded by the word "same." The average annual amount of Salary or Wages for the 36 months immediately preceding retirement should be inserted, preceded by the word "average," if the period of service is less than three years, then the average for the whole period.

**HEAD 7.—**A separate statement should be inserted of the average Annual Pensions, &c., preceding retirement, of each Enrolments (exclusive of salaries) included in the calculation of the Pension or Gratuity.

Whenever the value of a House or House Allowance is included, expect the salary and other emoluments which count for Pension purposes, it is to be reduced by one sixth of that amount, so that it shall not exceed one fifth of the whole.

From which an officer is allowed to retain for his own use will be taken into account for Pension purposes, the salary, at the annual average of the net receipts of the 36 months immediately preceding the Officer's retirement. These net receipts are to be ascertained by deducting from the salary and other emoluments which count for Pension purposes, the amount of Office Expenses, &c., as an officer may have had to defray from his own resources, for services for which he was remunerated by Fees. No deduction, however, is to be made in respect of Office Expenses provided from Public Funds for the due discharge of those duties to which a Fixed Salary is annexed. Papers of "Particulars" when forwarded to the Colonial Department should be accompanied by formal declarations from the retiree, showing the amount received by them for fees, and the amount defrayed as above. Office Expenses, &c., in each of the three years immediately preceding the day of the Colonial Government concerned to satisfy the statements before forwarding them to the Colonial Office. In the case of Officers re-circumstances be allowed to count for Pension purposes to the extent of more than one quarter of the salaries, and Fees will not in ordinary any case be allowed to count for Pension purposes during any period in which the whole of the Officer receiving them was not given to the Public Service.

**HEAD 8.—**In cases of infirmity, if the applicant is below the ordinary age for retirement, a Medical Certificate is to be furnished showing that he is disqualified by infirmity of mind or body for discharging the duties of his situation, and that such infirmity is likely to be permanent.

In case of ten years' service or more, this certificate should be signed by two Officers, of whom at least one should, if possible, be a Salaried Officer of the Government.

**HEAD 9.—**As to "broken" service see HEAD 5.

If the applicant has had any "acting" service, the details must be fully given, with a statement whether or not, during the "acting" service, he was connected with the permanent Civil Service of the Colony.

**HEAD 11.—**If, in special circumstances, a professional Civil Officer has been allowed to have "private practice" without forfeiting his claim to Pension, the facts are to be fully stated.

**HEAD 14.—**If the Applicant is liable to any deduction from his service under Clause 102 of the Colonial Regulations, the facts should be fully stated.

**HEAD 19.—**The length of service and other particulars of the computation are to be given. When an average of Salary is taken, the mode of calculating it (whether by months, &c.) is to be explained.
