With reference to Sir Herbert Read's letter No. 45747/23 dated 21st of September, I have the honor to say that the Regulations which accompanied the letter are in the form finally agreed on between the Consulting Engineer and myself.

2. The chief differences between the new Regulations and those sent under cover of my letter dated 3rd of May, arise from:

- (a) Deletion of sections regarded as unnecessary for the purpose of the Regulations
- (b) Deletion of sections covered by (i) the wiring Rules of the Institution of Electrical Engineers, to which works and installations are required to conform by Section 3 of the Regulations and (ii) the Electric Powers Ordinance, 1919.

- (c) Redrafting some of the Sections and definitions so as to conform more precisely with the Board of Trade and.
