I have been making enquiries and I find that the scheme referred to was examined here and that it was found not to be within the conditions of the Trade Facilities Act and that the responsibility would be under the Overseas Trade (Credit and Insurance) Acts, by which the Board of Trade are empowered to give credits to the suppliers of machinery in the ordinary course of events. I would add, however, that it is understood unofficially that the scheme has been abandoned.
