Your telegram of 23rd March, Jubaland. I am strongly in favour of cession taking place as early as possible but it is not clear to me whether it is proposed that this should take place before agreement reached in regard to Articles Nos. 6, 7 and 10 or whether it is suggested that the questions are first settled and then that transfer should follow. As regards the delimitation of the boundaries I agree that these can be settled after the cession. Reference to (a) I do not think that any satisfactory conclusion can be reached as to Article IX and perhaps part of Article VI referring to Somali(s) until the Commissioners have traversed the area and taken local evidence. I agree generally with the suggested conditions but am doubtful as to whether time will now allow for (a) determining the provincial boundaries near the approximate meridian or (b) visit to Elbera if the Commission is to visit Kisumu before the end of July. I am replying in regard to wireless as soon as I have the information required.
