I take it that the new Transport Agreement and consequently the new Colony Agreement should not be definitely concluded until the Transport Order-in-Council has come into force. The Order-in-Council provides that it shall come into force on such date as may be fixed by joint proclamation of the Governors of Kenya and Uganda and it is proposed when sending out the Order-in-Council to ask those Governors to telegraph the date, but there seems no reason why the Crown Agenta should not be instructed as soon as we actually receive the Order-in-Council to enter at once
