I have the honour to refer to Colonial Office despatch Kenya No.972 dated 16th September, 1924, and to inform you that after further consideration I do not wish to maintain my objection to the principle of aggregation of service for the purpose of the award of gratuities in the case of Non-Europeans who have service in both Police and Prisons Departments, as well as to those whose service has been in one or other of these Departments, in more than one East African Dependency.

2. Presumably any legislation necessary to give effect to these proposals should be framed so as to come into force on the same date in the territories concerned. I am asking the Governor of Uganda to send me copies of the Uganda Bill when drafted for consideration.

3. A copy of this despatch is being sent to the Officers Administering the Government of Uganda and the Tanganyika Territory.
