Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that the European Civil Service Association has made repres tions respecting the cost of transport of Medical Officers attending the wives and families of officials at outstations.

The relative Section (No.269) of the Kenya Code of Regulations reads as under:-

"If a member of an officer's family needs medical attendance the cost of the Medical Officer's transport must in all cases be defrayed by the officer himself, but the Travelling Allowance of a Government Medical Officer will be paid by the Government".

The revision of this Section has been discussed previously and Lieutenant Colonel Notley in his despatch, Confidential No. 243 of the 16th September, 1921, was unable in view of the financial position of the Colony to recommend any alteration in the existing arrangements. In this view Mr. Winston Churchill concurred vide his Confidential desiaton of the 5th January, 1922.

The financial position has since materially improved and I consider that the matter might receive reconsideration.
