I am to inform you that my Association is advised that. at the Meeting of the Council of the Mational Liberal Federation of India, on the 31st ultimo and the 1st instant, a strong protest was recorded against the policy of racial discrimination in East Africa. the segregation of Indians in special locations, and the prehibition from acculring property outside these locations. The Imperial Government was urged to carry out in the Kenye Colony and Tanganyika Territory of the policy of complete equality of treatment enunciated by the Viceroy; and especially in the matter of franchise and representation. Lord Milner's disapproval of this just policy was condemn and the representatives of India on the Lesgu of Nations were requested to lay the matter before the Leegue and to secure its support.
