C.O. letter 20230/1920 authorises us to pay a War gratuity of £14.10s/- to Mr. J. Levaridge. Can you say, please how the amount is calculated? The period on which it is based is 19 months; 7 months @ 10s/- = 7.0s/- leaving £11 for the first year, which is not a rate granted in the warrant. I assume that £1 is not deducted for overcost in the East-Africa Transport Corps when the non-commissioned officer received a commission.

We were instructed by the Government of Uganda that no military gratuities should be charged to Uganda funds. We do not know whether this decision has now been altered for the Uganda Volunteer Reserve. Will you therefore confirm that the amount payable in respect of his service in the Uganda Volunteer Reserve should be charged to Uganda funds, please?
