I am etc. to ack. the rect. of your letter of the 18th of September and to state that it is regretted that it has not been possible to settle your case ~~shorter~~ before this owing to the difficulty in obtaining the necessary information regarding it.

As His Lordship has decided that you shall relinquish your app't. in the K.A. Local Forces as from the 1st of Jan. 1920, and the Officer Paying Imperial Pensions, Ottawa, is being requested to arrange for you to be medically boarded and to receive any retired pay and medical treatment, which you would have received had you served under British Army Regts. Pending a decision as to the amount of retired pay (or which you may be eligible), His Officer has been requested to issue to you interim retired pay at the rate of \$27.10.00 per month from the 1st of January 1920, i.e., the date of the relinquishment of your app't.
