Sir,

I have the honour to transmit for your consideration the prescribed form of application for relief from public funds duly completed by the widow of the late I.J.J. Maciel, II Grade Clerk in the Treasury Department, who died at Mombasa on the 10th September, 1920, after 23 years' service under this Government.

2. The Treasurer, under whose Mr. Maciel served, recommends this as a deserving case.

3. As you will observe from the attached petition his widow is left to support seven children who are all minors.

4. In view of the very excellent service rendered by the petitioner's late husband I desire to recommend the grant of a gratuity equivalent to six months pay to his widow and I trust that you will sanction the payment of this.

5. A similar recommendation was approved by Lord Milner's despatch No. 100 of the 17th September 1911.

I the undersigned, the widow of the late Ismael  
Jerome Justignano Maciel, 2nd grade clerk, Treasury Dept.,  
East Africa Protectorate, beg most respectfully to forward  
the enclosed forms for gratuity praying that they may  
receive your sympathetic consideration.

2. My husband joined the Treasury Dept in July 1907,  
and expired at his desk in the office on 18th September  
1909, when lately on leave he had a severe attack of Influenza  
and had to return to East Africa in broken health owing to  
the need of his urgent presence in office, where he died  
after three months.

The untimely death of the bread-winner has thrown us,  
a family of eight persons, all helpless in every way on the  
verge of the world. Four of the children are schooling  
and two girls are of a marriageable age, and we have to be  
provided to settle them in life. Whatever expenditure  
shown on the attached form is the minimum and is certainly  
quite insufficient to cope with the ever rising prices.

3. In view of the circumstances mentioned above and  
the fact that we were solely dependent on my husband I beg  
most humbly to entreat you to sanction me a grant, in the  
form of an almsman's gratuity as a special case, for which  
I will ever feel grateful.

THE COLONY OF KENYA AND THE EAST AFRICA PROTECTORATE.

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**Form to be completed by distressed relatives of deceased officers  
who are applicants for relief from Public Funds.**

**Notes.—** Relatives of deceased Colonial Officers are not entitled to any relief from public funds, but in cases of destitution, and where there are no relatives able to afford help, a small compassionate gratuity is occasionally, of the circumstances, allowed. The amount of such gratuity will not, in any case exceed six months' salary of the deceased officer.
