Sir,

I have the honour to forward herewith
a form of particulars required for the
computation of a pension to Mr. E. S. Dave, a
2nd Grade Clerk in the Postal Department, who
has been pronounced unfit for further service
in this Colony by a Medical Board held on him
in India on the 8th December, 1920. A copy
of the proceedings of the Medical Board is
enclosed for your information.

2. Mr. Dave's services date from the
20th December, 1899, and he is, therefore,
eligible for a pension in respect of 20
completed years of service. The pension is
computed at Florins 949/22 per annum, with
effect from the 27th July, 1920, inclusive.

3. Although the report of the Medical
Board which invalidated this official is dated
the 8th December, 1920, I would recommend

that the pension be antedated to the 27th July, 1920, so as to cover the period of leave without pay in accordance with the precedent approved by Lord Milner in his despatch No. 429 of the 20th May, 1919.

4. Pending the receipt of your sanction to the pension recommended, I have authorized the grant of an ~~advisory~~ allowance to Mr. Dave at the rate of Rs. 720/- per annum from the date quoted.

- Para 1- If the rate of an Officer serving on the West Coast of Africa is stated to be whether he is entitled to that Grade (Colonial Regulations, 1438)
HEAD 3- State the description of Allowance for which the Applicant is recommended, viz. Superior, Compensation, Compassionate Allowance or Gratuity, and its amount. In the case of Pension claiming an addition to their Pension in respect of professional or other special qualifications should be stated, and a reference should be given to the authority under which the claim is made.
HEAD 4- If the service has been interrupted by one or more absences, the "breaks" should be stated before or after the number of years and months, and the cause, date, and circumstances of each break or breaks should be stated under heading d.

HEAD 15- The nature of service and dates pertaining to the compensation are to be given. When an amount of salary is stated, the mode of calculation is (whether by months, &c.) is to be explained.
