country. We sent this to the Gov.  
without comment, leaving it to  
him to decide how far the  
home practice could be adopted.

What we have to settle  
therefore is what our practice for

Local forces is to be : this can then 316  
be applied or not to Imperial  
personnel as is convenient.

Our last ruling on the subject  
was in Cdt/8917/20/K.A.R., where  
we agreed that £1.10 being paid to  
Post. M.O.'s for each board. It was  
not made clear then whether this meant  
for each patient examined or not.

I think that we should now  
~~consider that you see serious local objections~~  
rule that £1.10 should be paid  
when one patient is examined, not  
that where more than one is  
examined the fees shown in para. 3  
of 46735/20 should be paid for  
each session not exceeding 2½ hours;  
so that this arrangement should  
apply to K.A.R. & Local Forces  
examinations as well as to Imperial
