Sir,

With reference to Lord Milner's circular despatch of the 25th March, 1920, I have the honour to transmit herewith two authenticated and ten-pointed copies of "The Census Ordinance, 1921", to which I have assented in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, together with a statement of objects and reasons which has been prepared by the Attorney General.

2. Mr. C. E. Spencer, Senior Assistant Secretary, has been seconded for duty as Superintendent of Census, and is at present engaged on the necessary organization for the taking of a census of non-natives in Kenya on the 24th programme. It was considered impracticable to attempt a census of natives; I have however arranged that Administrative officers shall obtain as close an estimate of the native population as may be possible and it is anticipated that the figures will represent the actual numbers with a fair degree of accuracy.

4. A sum of £500 has been provided in the draft Estimates for 1921 for the expense of taking the census.
