THE APPOINTMENT AND GENERAL CLAUSES (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE, 1921.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Ordinance was passed to carry out necessary changes consequent upon the Protectorate becoming a Colony, viz. the definition of Colony and Protectorate, and provision for the application of Ordinances to both the Colony and Protectorate unless the application is otherwise limited.

As under a number of Ordinances regulations which were intended to have the effect of Rules it was considered desirable to take the opportunity of providing that "Rules" included "Regulations".
