AMENDMENT (SCHEDULE) ORDINANCE, 1921.
STATEMENT OF GOVERNOR AND MEMBERS.

This Ordinance was passed to correct one or two anomalies in the Principal Ordinance and to raise the Scale of duties payable to the Scale in force in England under the latest Finance Act.

The first anomaly is that while interest runs from the date of death on unpaid estate duty, it ceased to run after six months. This has been reversed.

Provision is made whereby failure to render a valuation and inventory within a specified time involves the estate in a penalty under Section 31 of the Principal Ordinance.
