for about 6 or 8 days at a time continuously, with very
little relief with medicines. Between the acute attacks,
the pain is less and patient is able to work under great
difficulties.

The pain over the Right supra orbital nerve must be
very severe at times, as distinct beads of perspiration
soon appear, and a distinct inflammation over the supra
orbital ridge was present during the last attack, a few
days ago.

Owing to the nature of his work which entails great
concentration of mind on what he is doing, he is unable
to carry on without making mistakes in checking his accou-
nts when the attacks are present.
