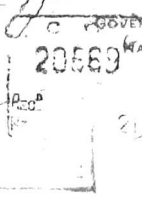

ING'S AFRICAN RIFLES.

Sir,

I have the honour to address you on the status and emoluments of Lieutenant (Temporary Captain) F. J. Page, who is at present performing the duties of Officer-in-Charge, War Records, East Africa.

2. This Officer by Confidential Supplement to General Routine Order No. 32(7) of the 27th April, 1918, was graded as a Staff Captain with effect from the 5th April, 1918, and as no provision for such rank existed in the Local Forces he has received pay and allowances at Imperial rates, his emoluments being charged directly to, and accepted by, the War Office. There appears no doubt, however, that he was regarded by General Headquarters as a member of the Protectorate Forces, and authority for his re-engagement as a member of the Unattached List under the terms of Force Orders

Orders No. 23 and 48 of 1919 was given by the Staff Captain, East Africa Expeditionary Force. I attach copies of the relative orders and memoranda on this subject for facility of reference. Captain Page is described in the Army List as Lieutenant (Temporary Captain) East Africa Protectorate Forces - Class F.F. - and I would observe further that Officers of the Indian Army and of the King's African Rifles were allowed whilst serving in this country the choice of drawing pay at East African rates or on the scale applicable to the force to which they belonged.

3. In view of the incidence of his pay the Auditor is of opinion that Captain Page is an Imperial Officer, and, as such, ineligible for the concessions granted to personnel of the Local Forces under the Force Orders named in the second paragraph of this despatch. I do not consider that he should be penalized as against other officers still retained for the winding up of the affairs of the late campaign merely for the reason that his specific rank is not a recognized grade in the East African Protectorate Forces and I recommend that his status be regularized as a member of these forces by his appointment retrospectively from the 1st of April, 1919, (the date of his re-engagement, as a Captain in the East Africa Expeditionary Force) at the pay and allowances laid down for that rank, viz., a total of Fls. or Rs. 1,009-75 cts. per mensem.

4. Captain Page's monthly emolument as a Staff Captain amounted to Rs. 400-03 cts. from the 1st April, - 30th June, 1919. The sum of Rs. or Rs. 1,000/- is apart from the first and I trust that you will agree which will involve a recommendation for his services from the CONDITION Charges Account. I submit that a more equitable procedure both from the standpoint of expenditure and of the officer concerned,

5. The question of relief by Captain Page in respect of alleged overpayments during the period of his leave of absence has been dealt with in your telegram of the 11th March.

6. Captain Page's release is recommended to take place not later than the 30th June next, and I shall be glad, therefore, if a decision regarding his emoluments may be expedient and communicated to me by telegraph.

7. I may add that owing to the uncertainty of his position Captain Page has agreed only to draw Rs. 500/- per mensem since the 1st October last pending the settlement of his status and privileges.
