

**THE LOCAL CLEARING SERVICE ESTABLISHMENT
ORDINANCE, 1921.**

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

It was pointed out by the Secretary of State that the Treaty of Peace Ordinance, 1920, was intended to establish a Clearing Office in the Colony. An Amending Bill was accordingly drafted for the purpose. After this was passed by the Order-in-Council, a Bill was presented and a Bill was passed to carry out the necessary amendments. This Bill was considered by a Committee appointed by the Legislative Council for the purpose who advised the consolidation of the two preceding Bills and the Treaty of Peace Ordinance, 1920, and the result is as follows.

The present Ordinance follows the Sierra Leone Ordinance which was sent out by the Secretary of State as a model. It does not follow the form of the previous Ordinance in requiring the Order-in-Council to the Colony and Protectorate, because the Imperial enactment already does so, but it recites this in the preamble, and in the body of the Ordinance establishes the Clearing Office and details the necessary modifications which are requisite to give the Orders-in-Council full force and effect in the Colony and Protectorate.
