April 5th. Your telegram of 28 March 1921 of approximate figures cover expenditure on the West African account and locally during the period 1st November 1920 to February 28th 1921. One, Common Charges Account £17,000; Two, Salaries and other pensions £13,000; Three, expenditure not yet allocated £40,000; Four advance made to Clearance Section King's African Rifles ^{for R.A.F. loan expenditure} £50,000; Five, payment by ~~Colonial Agent~~ on King's African Rifles War account £30,000 total £150,000. Add figures advised by my telegram 3rd November No. 622 namely £122,000. Grand total to February 28th £272,000. Local garrison expenditure not included as it is charged against local votes. Understand that question of liability if any different that Africa Office advise in respect of Common Charges Account not yet definitely settled.
