Your telegram 12th May Public Health Bill
suggested amendment in clause fiftyone would nullify
whole object of clause. In this country where there
is grave danger of infection from venereal disease
of large numbers of ignorant natives not acquainted
with after effects of complaint provision as in clause
fiftyone considered essential. Deletion or weakening
of this clause would eliminate provision made for
examination of inhabitants of places or areas particularly
suspected. Clause fiftyone necessary and desirable
to protect natives from results of ravages venereal
disease. Conditions in this country naturally differ
from those in England where population educated.
Powers under Clause No.51 have precedent in South
African legislation from which whole of part five taken.
Trust you will agree to retention of Clause fiftyone
as drafted. It is vital to health of colony.
