FINANCIAL POSITION

Has revised Budget for 1922 and by drastic pruning and suspension of unfilled posts deficit reduced to £416,000. If new customs duties imposed additional £150,000 revenue might be raised. A further £87,000 might be raised by flat land tax of 3d per acre but this might cause hardship and would meet with great opposition. No further revenue suggestions and expense can only be reduced by cutting local allice of 50%. Bringing here detailed information for discussion.

I have discussed this with Mr. Rushton. By drastic pruning the Governor has cut down the Estimates of Expenditure by £184,000, so reducing the deficit from £600,000, as estimated in his telegram of the 16th June, (30096/21) to £416,000. Towards bridging this gap he hopes that the increase of customs duties (now agreed to) will bring in an additional £150,000; but even so, there still remains a gap of £266,000. Towards meeting this the Governor can only suggest a flat land tax of 3d per acre. *Such a tax is then to be a... it falls alike on the land... the farmer who is... and as the Governor says,* would hit the newcomer hard; but in present circumstances we simply cannot afford to neglect any source of Revenue, and I think that we ought to discuss this suggestion further with the Governor when he arrives. If we decide to impose the tax, I think that we

ought to make it quite clear that we do so simply as an emergency measure, and that we propose to abolish it as soon as the financial situation permits. The only other possible way of reducing the gap seems to me to reduce in some way the cost of the Civil Service. ^{It is best} ~~And we~~ hope there will be a material fall in the local cost of living before the 1st April, 1922, so that we may be able to affect a corresponding reduction in the local allowance without causing hardship to the officials. The East African Service as a whole is by no means over-paid - their scales even since the recent revision compare very unfavourably with the West African scales - and they are now clamouring for a general increase, which in present financial circumstances, it will of course be ^{impossible} ~~impossible~~ to grant: so that I fear it will be impossible to cut down the local allowance, unless there is some real drop in the cost of living, without causing a very bitter outcry among the local officials. Mr. Rushton has, however, suggested to me - and the recent Committee of the Legislative Council on Salaries have taken the same line - that considerable economy might be effected by cutting down the staff without causing any real loss of efficiency. This seems to

to be an avenue of economy which ought to be explored further, and I think that we might take up the point with Sir E. Northey when he arrives.

341 1st July Your telegram 22nd June have revised Budget for 1922 and by drastic pruning and suspension of unfilled posts particularly Police Medical Agricultural deficit reduced £416,000. If new customs duties can be imposed additional £150,000 revenue might be realised. A possible £37,000 might be raised by a flat land tax of three pence per acre but this seems likely to cause hardship to newcomers and would have to be enforced as a Government measure against great opposition. Can suggest no further possible means of raising revenue. Only possible reduction of expenditure is on local allowance of officials of any fall in local prices at present justified only slight curtailment. Bringing home for discussion detailed information on Budget. For current financial year every possible economy short of reduction in permanent establishment is being effected.

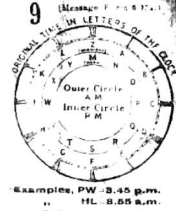
