Sir,

With reference to your Confidential despatch of May 23rd enclosing a copy of a memorandum from the Italian Ambassador on the subject of the Marehan, I have the honour to inform you that he is mistaken both as regards the existing condition and as regards the general principles governing the movements of these nomadic tribes.

- 2. Administration would become impossible were the Italian Ambassador's contention accepted that the areas of these nomadic tribes cannot be defined. The bendency of the stronger tribes is constantly to move about looking for better water and pasturage, but it is a tendency that must be as constantly shecked, as it is almost invariably at the expense of their weaker neighbours
- 3. Our policy has always been to set very clearly lefined lines beyond which each tribe shall not pass, and because the Italian Government is unwilling to adopt the same policy, they cannot claim

claim to dictate to us our policy.

- the Italian Government set out in the last paragraph but one of the Ambassador's memorandum with reference to the "trices east of the zone at present occupied by the Marenan" when it is remembered that the home of the Marenan tribe is east of the Juba river, and that a very large number of the Marenan now in Jubaland have come in from Italian territory in the last ten years. What the request of the Italian Government actually means is that our tribes are to be penalised for the benefit of their tribes.
- 5. The memorandum of the Italian Ambassador contains one serious misstatement in saying that "in reality the majority of these trices is at present still within the territory of the paga and Northern Prontier District." Not only is this not the case at the moment, but it never has been the case.
- 6. I consider that the policy of checking the propensity of these nomadic bribes to wander is of supreme importance, difficult though it is to put it into effect. I would therefore ask that it may be made paite clear to the Iterian Government that it is the intention of this government not only to allow no harman. It is

within the territory which is remaining British, but also to prevent by every means in their power any increase from Italian territory of the Ogaden tribes living in the Wajir and Lorian areas.
