Irregularity proving Evans entirely unsuitable for
position of Deputy Director. When last in England
drew pay through Cox and Company. Also locally
through Graves Registration Unit being overpaid
£338 none of which recovered. Medical Board found
him debilitated as result of malaria and
recommended 3 months leave out of country. I am
that he should be instructed to proceed to England
in connection with investigation of report which
follows by post. Understand Reilly fully concur
to carry on.
