The following facts relating to the appointment of
Lieutenant Webster to the Military Audit Department will furnish the
material you require for replying to the 3/3 despatch 1285 of
- 14 - 1919.

Appointment and pay

Discharged while serving as Sergeant in Army Service Corps and appointed to the Military Audit with relative precedence of 2nd Lieutenant on 23rd November 1917 (General Routine Order 493 of 26. II- 1917)

Pay.

Major Venables, Assistant Adjutant General ruled that
the ~~Adjutant~~ Major Officer should be paid at the same rate as Adjutant
the Unattached List, West African Protectorate Areas, namely
300 a year.

Proposed rates for officers of the Unattached List were increased by 19% and the General Officer Commanding sanctioned the recommendation that the increased rates should also apply to those officers of the Military Audit holding relative precedence whose rates had been fixed at similar rates.

The actual payment of this increase in salary was not made till after Lieutenant Webster had left the country, he having previously given directions as to its disposal. For this reason Last Pay Certificate should have been supplemented by a later one. This is now attached.
