I have the honour to transmit herewith a form of particulars required for the computation of pension to Mr. J.S.Dias, 1st Grade Clerk, Administration, who has been pronounced unfit for further service in this Colony by a Medical Board held on him in India on the 20th of August last. A copy of the proceedings of this Board is enclosed herewith for your information.

2. Mr. Dias' services date from the 22nd of February, 1897, and he is, therefore, eligible for a pension in respect of twenty four completed years. The pension has been computed at Rs. 1463.90 a year with effect from the 25th of August last inclusive.

3. Pending the receipt of your sanction to the pension recommended, I have approved the payment to Mr. Dias of an alimentary allowance at the rate of Rs. 1140/- a year with effect from the 25th of August, 1921, inclusive.

Instructions.

INSTRUCTIONS REFERRED TO ON PAGE 1.

If this Paper of Particulars and the Certificates connected with it, be not sent in original, the copies must be duly attested.

HEAD 1 OF PAPER.—In the case of an Officer serving on the West Coast of Africa, a statement is to be added whether he is a native of that Coast. (Colonial Regulations, § 430).

HEAD 3.—State the description of Allowance for which the Applicant is recommended, *viz.*, Superannuation Compensation, Compassionate Allowance, or Gratuity, and its amount. In the case of Persons claiming an addition to their Pensions in respect of Professional or other special qualifications the same should be stated, and a reference should be given to the authority under which the claim is made.

HEAD 5.—If the service has been interrupted by one or more breaks, the word "broken" should be added before or after the number of years and months, and the causes, dates, and circumstances of the break or breaks should be stated under heading 9.

HEAD 6.—If the Person retiring has been in receipt of the same Salary, or in the class from which he retires for the 36 months immediately before the date of his retirement, the actual annual rate of Salary or Wages at that date should be inserted, preceded by the word "actual." In other cases the average annual amount of Salary or Wages for the 36 months next preceding the date of retirement should be inserted, preceded by the word "average," but if the whole period of service is less than three years, then the average for the whole period of service should be inserted.

HEAD 7.—A separate statement should be inserted of the average Annual Value, for the 36 months immediately preceding retirement, of each Emolument (exclusive of Salary or wages) which is claimed, to ascertain the amount of the Pension or Gratuity.

I have the value of a "House or Home" Allowance, &c., as above, exceeded and is in an office establishment which counts for Pension purposes, it is to be reduced to the value of the office, so that it shall not exceed one fourth of the whole.

For which a deduction is allowed to re-bury the deceased will be taken into account for pension purposes, at the rate of one third of the net receipts of the 36 months next preceding the date of retirement. These amounts are to be ascertained by deducting from the gross amount of Fees and Office Expenses, &c., as an officer may have had to bear from his own resources, in performing the services for which he was remunerated by Fees. No deduction, however from the Fees should be made in respect of Office Expenses, provided the Public Funds, for the due discharge of those duties to which a Fixed Salary is attached, "Letters of Marque" when forwarded to the Colonial Department should be accompanied by full declarations from the returning Officers, showing the amount received by them for fees, and the amount defrayed as above for Office Expenses, &c., in each of the three years immediately preceding the retirement. It will be the duty of the Colonial Government to satisfy themselves of the accuracy of such statements before forwarding them to the Colonial Office. In the case of Officers receiving Fixed Salaries and Fees, the Fees will not be ordinary circumstances be allowed to count for Pension purposes to the extent of more than one quarter of the Salaries and Fees will not in any case be allowed to count for Pension purposes during the period in which the whole time of the Officer receiving them was not given to the Public Service.

HEAD 8.—In cases of infirmity, if the Applicant is below the ordinary age for retirement, a Medical Certificate is to be furnished showing that he is disqualified by infirmity of mind or body for discharging the duties of his station, and that such infirmity is likely to be permanent.

In case of ten years' service or more, this certificate should be signed by two Officers, whom at least one should, if possible, be a Salaried Officer of the Government.

HEAD 9.—As to "broken" service see HEAD 5.

If the Applicant did not "act" in "acting" service, the details must be fully given, with statement whether or not during the "acting" service, he was connected with the permanent Civil Service of the Colony.

HEAD 11.—If, in special circumstances, a professional Civil Officer has been allowed to have "private practice" without forfeiting his claim to Pension, the facts are to be fully stated.

HEAD 13.—If the Applicant is liable to any deduction from his service under Clause 102 of the Colonial Regulations, the facts should be fully stated.

HEAD 19.—The length of service and other particulars of the computation are to be given. When an average of Salary, &c., is taken, the mode of calculating it (whether by months, &c.) is to be explained.
