Sir,

I have the honour to transmit herewith a form of particulars required for the computation of pension to Mr. Nandlal M. Mehta, 3rd Grade Clerk in the Treasury, who has been pronounced unfit for further service in this Colony by a Medical Board held on him in Nairobi on the 1st of June last. A copy of the proceedings of this Board is enclosed herewith for your information.

2. Mr. Mehta's service dates from the 23rd of March, 1909, and he is, therefore, eligible for a pension in respect of twelve completed years. The pension is computed at F1s.480/- a year with effect from the 18th December, 1921, inclusive.

3. Pending the receipt of your sanction to the pension recommended, I have approved of the payment to Mr. Mehta of an alimentary allowance at the rate of F1s.360/- a year with effect from the 18th December, 1921, inclusive.

Instructions.

INSTRUCTIONS REFERRED TO ON PAGE 1.

If this Paper of Particulars and the Certificates connected with it, be not in original, the copies must be duly attested.

HEAD 1.—In the case of an Officer serving in the West Coast of Africa, a statement is to be given whether he is a native of those Countries.

HEAD 2.—State the Description of Allowance for which he is recommended, viz., Superannuation, Gratuity, Compassionate Allowance, or other, and its amount. In the case of Professional or other special qualifications, in addition to their Pensions in respect of Professional or other special qualifications, the same should be stated, and a reference should be given to the authority under which the claim is made.

HEAD 3.—If the service has been interrupted by one or more breaks, the word "broken" should be added after the number of years and months, and the causes, dates, and circumstances of each break should be stated under heading 4.

HEAD 4.—If a Person retiring has been in receipt of the same Salary, or in the class from which he retires for the 36 months immediately before the date of his retirement, the actual annual rate of Salary or Wages at that date should be inserted, preceded by the word "actual." In other cases, an average annual amount of Salary or Wages for the 36 months next preceding the date of retirement should be inserted, preceded by the word "average," and if the whole period of service is less than three years, then the average for the whole period of service should be inserted.

HEAD 5.—A separate statement should be inserted of the average Annual Value, for the 36 months next preceding retirement, of such Emoluments (exclusive of salary or wages) which it claimed to be included in the Calculation of the Pension or Gratuity.

Whenever the value of a House or House Allowance, so ascertained, exceeds one-sixth the salary and other emoluments which count for Pension purposes, it is to be reduced to one-sixth of that amount, so that it shall not exceed one-seventh of the whole.

Fees which an Officer is allowed to retain for his own use will be taken into account for Pension purposes, with regular salary, at the annual average of the net receipts of the 36 months next preceding the Officer's retirement. These net receipts are to be ascertained by deducting from the gross amount of Fees such Office Expenses, &c., as any Officer may have had to deduct from his own resources, in performing the services for which he was remunerated by Fees. Deduction, however, of the Fees should be made in respect of Office Expenses provided Public Funds, for the due discharge of those duties to which a Fixed Salary is attached. Particulars of "Particulars" when forwarded to the Colonial Department should be accompanied by declarations from the retiring Officers, showing the amount received by them for fees, and amount defrayed as above for Office Expenses, &c., in each of the three years immediately preceding the retirement. It will be the duty of the Colonial Government concerned to see themselves of the accuracy of such statements before forwarding them to the Colonial Office. In the case of Officers receiving Fixed Salaries and Fees, the Fees will not in any circumstances be allowed to count for Pension purposes to the extent of more than one-quarter the Salaries, and Fees will not in any case be allowed to count for Pension purposes during the period in which the whole time of the Officer receiving them was not given to the Public Service.

HEAD 6.—In cases of infirmity, if the Applicant is below the ordinary age for retirement, a Medical Certificate is to be furnished showing that he is incapacitated by infirmity of mind or body for discharge of his duties, and that such infirmity is likely to be permanent.

In case of ten years' service or more, this certificate should be signed by two Officers, of whom at least one should, if possible, be a Salaried Officer of the Government.

HEAD 7.—As to "broken" service see HEAD 3.

If the Applicant has had any "acting" service, the details must be fully given, with statement whether or not, during the "acting" service, he was connected with the performance of Civil Service of the Colony.

HEAD 8.—If, in special circumstances, a professional Civil Officer has been allowed to have "private practice" without forfeiting his claim to Pensions, the facts are to be fully stated.

HEAD 9.—If the Applicant is liable to any deduction from his service under Clause 102 of the Colonial Regulations, the facts should be fully stated.

HEAD 10.—The length of service and other particulars of the computation are to be given. When an average of Salary, &c., is taken, the mode of calculating it (whether by months, &c.,) is to be explained.
