gak With reference to Your Lordship's despatch No. 1436 of the 29th December last, I have the honour to report that Mr. S. M. Heaysman, late Corporal in the East Africa Military Labour Corps, was discharged at Wynberg, Cape Colony, on the 31st August 1918 as permanently unfit for general war service.

2. The South African Imperial Pensions Board subsequently awarded Mr. Heaysman a pension based on 100% disability up to 31st January, 1919, subject to re-assessment after further medical examination. No further award has been notified to this Government and I would suggest that Mr. T. W. Heaysman should apply for later news of his brother to


