Gentlemen,

Your No. 139 M/S.A. 393 dated 27th June 1921.

In reply to your letter as above, I have the honour to inform you that my telegram of 6th June last, to which you refer, was sent because certain officers were sent out at a higher commencing salary, than the minimum of the approved scale for their respective posts. Cases in point are the engagements of -

2. At the date of my telegram I had received no advice of any alteration in the scales shown above, and the fact of these officers being engaged at higher rates caused great discontent amongst other officers in similar grades who were already in the Service.
