Sir,

With reference to your letter No. P. Pensions/Misc 161 of October 13, I beg to state that since April 1st, I have ceased to draw my salary from, and am no longer directly employed by, the Foreign Office.

I am now being paid a salary of \$200.00 a month by H.E.M. Consul here, out of his Office allowance. It was, however, explained to me by Mr Sherwood, Inspector General of Consulates, that this was an arrangement between H.E.M. Consul and myself, terminable at his pleasure, and giving me no claim on H.M.'s Government.

I am, therefore, adding the words "except temporary employment in the British Consulate, Seattle" to my Pension Certificates.
