

S. - Reference my despatch No. 74 of October 10th addressed to British East Africa and Uganda, please communicate following to Major Hawkins, begins :-

Regarding proposed reconnaissance by Sudan, Uganda and Kenya Troops to meet now at MORUA KIPPI, I am now advised by local officials that route from LOSINGA lacks grazing and water necessary for force of 100 rifles and donkey transport which latter is considered minimum that can be sent owing to hostile attitude of TAPOSANS, trustworthy guides are also lacking. It is considered risk of exhibiting to local natives difficulties and possible failure of troops most undesirable. Regret I must therefore abandon meeting this year. My intention for current year is to advance our post at LOSINGA to a site south east of Aboya Hills with view to obtaining further intelligence and gaining closer touch with local inhabitants. From this new site it may be possible to arrange reconnaissance further East in spring of 1922. Ende.
