

Paraphrase of telegram No. 40 from

Mr. Cane July 25.

Fitawrari Hafta Giorgis and all Chiefs accompanied  
Heir apparent on his return here on July 20 from expedition  
in the north.

It is at present intended to remove Lijyast (and is  
temporarily detained one day's journey from Adis Ababa  
(attached to minor chief) to Ras Fensa's (or Gugsa's) country  
which is some two days' journey from here.

In addition to the above Ras Seyoum has come here.
