Fitawari Hapta Giorgis and all Chief's accompanied

It is at present intended to remove Lijyasu (who is
temporarily detained one day's journey from Adis Ababa
(attached to minor chief) to Ras Fensa's (or Gugsu's) country
which is some two days' journey from here.

In addition to the above Ras Seyoum has come here.
