Telegram No. 47 to Adis Abeba.

A telegram dated 12th instant has been received from Governor of Kenya to the effect that Assafou is insisting that the refugee Sudan natives should be handed over to him, and this in spite of a written guarantee that his only object was to ensure that peace should be restored.

Please take all measures in your power to prevent an incursion by Assafou into British area and the collision with British troops which would result therefrom.
