Sir,

I am directed by Mr. Secretary Montagu to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 9th June, No. 27830/1921, regarding the attitude of the Indian community in Kenya towards the payment of income tax. That letter crossed with the letter from this Office of 10th June, I. & O. 28/21, from which it will be seen that the Government of India have already telegraphed to Mr. Jeevanjee strongly deprecating action of the kind contemplated and pointing out that such action must prejudice the negotiations now proceeding and can only harm the Indian cause.

Mr. Montagu readily accepts the suggestion that he should send a message to the Indians in the Colony, and he suggests for Mr. Churchill's consideration that in the circumstances the message should be to the effect that the Secretary of State for India entirely associates himself with the telegram already sent by the Government.
