Dear Sir,

I wish to inform you that at present the mail service between Abyssinia and East African Colonies- Kenya Colony and Protectorate, Uganda, Tanganyika Territory and Somaliland- is most unsatisfactory indeed. There is no regular connection between Addis Ababa and Mombasa, and in the delivery of all correspondence to and from these countries depends entirely on occasional and irregular sailing between the two named ports. In fact there is hardly any or British possessions so badly served with mails as those great and important African colonies. And a regular and efficient mail service is indispensable to the progress and commercial and industrial development of any country. It occurred to me that regularization of these deplorable conditions could be found in a reliable, regular, weekly mail sail service between Addis Ababa and Mombasa (all European correspondence requiring twice at least once a week) and I suggested this problem to most careful investigation and scrutiny. I have been assisted in this work by Major General Sir William G. Brewster, K.C.B., and his professional staff, and I have the honour to submit herewith to your consideration, H.M.G., the result of our labours resp. the proposal of such a service.

In this Africa Service Committee proposed to maintain fully equipped, ready AIR MAIL SERVICE between ADDIS ABABA and MOMBASA, and complete journey each way from either end, to provide accommodation of the latest and best type (not less than 4 with 2 spare engines), to cover addresses at each port of call, and to bear all expenses connected therewith, salaries of pilots, mechanics and all other staff etc. on condition that

that E.M. Government will guarantee the Company a minimum revenue from all sources connected with this Air Service of £25,000.- (fifty thousand pounds ster.) per annum. That is to say that E.M. Government would undertake to make up the difference between the said sum of £25,000.- and the total amount of all monies received by the Company for carrying mails, parcels, goods, passengers etc., should the latter not reach the figure of £25,000.-

5. The machines will call at following places for delivery and receipt of mails etc.:

ADMIRALTY

MADRAS (or JIBOUTI)

A place to be chosen in accordance with the wishes of E.M. Government

OMALA

MAURITIUS (MAURITIUS)

KISUMU

LAKE

MOMBASA

The distance to be covered on such full journey is about 2000 miles, making total mileage per annum (104 flights) of ca. 31240 miles. It is proposed to use the latest and very powerful machines (de Havilland 10) with a load capacity of 2200 lbs.

4. The books of the Company relating to this service would be open at all times to inspection by E.M. Auditor and, if desired, kept under the latter's supervision and instructions. Any payment or subsidy received from the Italian Government for carrying mails and parcels to and from and between the ports of call situated in Italian territory, would be credited to the general revenue of the service and deducted from any sum payable by E.M. Government.
