I was referred to an entry in the ... with
Mr. ... at the Colonial Office on April 26th that a
telegram had been despatched to the Governor of Kenya
Colony informing him that there was no objection to the
United Methodists taking over the work of the Neukirchen
Mission or to the Africa Inland Mission continuing to
occupy the stations of the Leipzig Mission.

I have now received a letter from the
Director of the Leipzig Mission saying that the trans-
ference of the care of the Christians formerly connected
with/

with their mission at the three stations (Kutha, Nyambani and Malindi to the Africa Inland Mission, meets with their approval and I have also been informed by the Rev. C.E. Harbert, manager of the Africa Inland Mission who is at present in this country, that his society is prepared to assume responsibility for this work.

I understand that the suggestion has been made to the Governor of Kenya Colony that the property of these missions should be placed in the hands of the Board of Trustees which has been appointed in Kenya Colony of the German missions in Tanganyika Territory. I suggested at the interview on April 25th that this Board might find considerable difficulty in looking after the properties in Kenya Colony as the missions which have accepted responsibility for the work are not represented on it and that it would be simpler if the properties of the German missions in each instance could be transferred in trust directly to the mission taking over the work. The Standing Committee having received an assurance in writing from the authorities of both the Leipzig Mission and the Neukirchen Mission/

Mission that they would have no objection to such an arrangement recommend that representatives of the African Inland Mission should be made trustees for the property of the Leipzig Mission and that representatives of the United Methodist Church should be appointed trustees for the property of the Neukirchen Mission. It appears to them that such an arrangement would be in accord with the provisions of Article 458 of the Peace Treaty and it would in their view be much the simplest method of dealing with the property.
