Colonial Office 6.15 P.M. 1st August 1922

My dear Sir, I have been informed by the Economic and  
Financial Committee to the effect that your Excellency  
begin to respect the fact of having been informed  
of your Excellency's approaching departure that various  
communications be made to the Secretary of State for the Colonies  
before the situation becomes complicated by any public  
announcement as to the great necessity for your  
Excellency remaining on in Kenya at least until the  
effect of some of their recommendations as have been  
and have been felt  
of those recommendations as well as others now  
under consideration will include drastic changes of  
policy that a new Governor will hesitate to  
implement if much valuable work has been lost  
and the public confidence is so necessary  
that it is necessary to have your Excellency  
stay in Kenya  
They believe that public confidence is being  
restored at present by complete and sympathetic  
understanding between themselves and your Excellency.  
For these reasons they consider that continuity  
is essential at the present stage of attempt at reconstruc-  
tion. (Ends.)
