I have discussed with Mr. Bottomley and our conclusions are briefly as follows :-

(1) It seems clear that we must now face the inevitable and abandon any further attempts to save B.E.A.D.O.C. as a Society.

(2) Whether the Bank has anything more than a moral claim it is impossible to say without the papers. Major D. Ott, Mr. Holm and Mr. Thomas, Local Manager of the Bank, think that they have. The Governor assumes that it is possible to exclude the land from liquidation and that on the liquidation of B.E.A.D.O.C the land reverts to the Government.

(3) The Governor says nothing about the mill and the present flax crop. What he contemplates apparently is that the creditors should extract all the money they can from

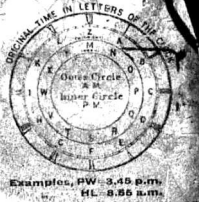
