There is no reason to postpone this
for discussion with Mr. Head & Co.,
I think, as the matter is really
quite clear.

In 1890, a Leuna, his
son successor, was "Lay boy"
of the Masai — i.e. medicine
man of the 1st. grade. says
against such influence over
all sections of the Masai
that the position of Leuna came
to be regarded by European
officers not really cognisant
of the facts as very dangerous
with that of Paramount
chief. When the Govt.
appointed Leuna as
"Paramount chief" a on

MINUTES NOT TO BE WRITTEN
ON THIS SIDE

or "Pouerongfe chief".
The Govt. were in fact
acting on a mis-
understanding of an
normal Massai tribal
history & tradition.

Seggi, an elder son of
Lemane, is in fact
chief of the Laisen
Gitate "laisen" or
medicine-men, who
belong to the Sighani
~~and~~ (Engidongi division)
of the Massai. These
live near Ngong Hills
& En Poringo Marsh.

When Lemane died
(about 1911) Seggi was
about 15 years old.
He was unanimously
chosen as "laisen".
The Govt. made him
"Paramount Chief" &
Seggi's wife assumed
the title being
Ngalekuru & Ngaela.

When Seggi came to
age he wished to assume
the title of Paramount
Chief, he was given

every opportunity, but
met with failure. He was
found quite unreliable, and
lacking in energy, physique &
moral courage; his adm^r
advises board him & he
looked to the Govt. to do
every thing for him.

The Sighani ~~and~~ (Engidongi)
for whom he belongs acknowledge
him as their chief; but
they are a small section
of the Massai (probably
some 2000 or 1900). The
Parks (the most important
division in the Massai & the
most troublesome) have
meted him with open
contempt, while the
Daita Sira & other divisions
have not recognised him at
all.

The Govt. now propose
on the recommendation
of the Massai General
Council to revert to
normal Massai
practice by abolishing
the post of Paramount
Chief & putting Seggi
(where he will be) as chief

After Eng. 109
like any similar section-chief.

The Massai General Council, it may be mentioned, was formed in 1918 : it is composed of elders who are representatives of all the Massai ; it is a permanent council to discuss the affairs of the tribe - matters arising out of the 1911 Massai Agreement.

There can then be no danger, I think, of the proposed action causing unrest among the Massai (see Co. Disp. H. 12/19 on May 6/1302/28 Bal.).

The fact that Legge was recommended by the D.G.O. for a medal of the first class for valour chief of others for his services does not affect the matter : as Paramount (with he was in the easy position of achieving this honour irrespective of merit : the recommendation respecting him of services need not be read out

out here, but reading 107 between or even on - the lines, the "terms" of the Paramount Chief compare unfavourably with those, say, of Legishon (a headman) or Sendeu (chief of the Loita).

I have the honour to refer to Mr. Walter Long's despatch No. 899 of the 11th December, 1918.

2. Since that date Seggi Ole Lenana has been given a further trial as Paramount Chief, with the result that I can only confirm the recommendations made in Sir Charles Bowring's despatch No. 218 of the 28th March, 1918. During this period Seggi's influence with his tribe has, if possible, decreased and throughout the recent unrest he was totally powerless to give any assistance whatever to the Government, even by restraining those witch doctors of his own clan without whose countenance the up-rising would not have occurred.

3. Accordingly the Officer in Charge of the Masai Reserve was instructed to lay the question before the Masai General Council who have recommended that the office of Paramount Chief be abolished and that Seggi be placed on the same rate of pay as chiefs of other sections in his capacity as head of the Engidengi Clan.

4. Should Your Grace desire further details I would suggest that Mr. R.W. Hemsted, C.B.E., who recently sailed for leave in England be consulted. I trust
