Vague talk about notes and alterations, but that do not constitute a proper notice.

Their notice is used first, but that is only five months before the date of commencement.

Conceded there is not so much substance in all this - because we were not in fact misled - but if the local manager cancelled the notice - it may be that that fact coupled with these successive letters ^{of June 1919} may have led the local people to expect a fresh 12 months notice.

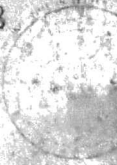
