Received Colonial Office 2.10 a.m. 31st October, 1923

No. 216. 30th October. My telegram of 13th October  
re. 200 Voi Taveta line. I understand that Governor of  
Tanganyika no longer requires material from Voi Kake line as  
material will be available from central line. After con-  
sideration in the Executive Council and with full concurrence  
of general manager I am satisfied that £80,000 can be  
reallocated under the £1,000,000 loan schedule to provide  
£80,000 for purchase £30,000 for reconditioning the Voi Kake  
line. Tanganyika estimates for latter service £40,000 but  
general manager Uganda Railway after personal inspection  
considers that the smaller sum will suffice for the time  
being any ultimate excess being met from the funds (for)  
betterment. General Manager proposes to run the line on  
most economical methods at first with daylight service only  
and with native staff and he anticipates considerable in-  
crease particularly timber traffic. I trust you will agree  
to the Uganda Railway taking over the line on above terms.  
It will be necessary to prepare plans and sections and make  
certain surveys in connection with regrading. Please reply  
by telegraph. Despatch follows regarding particulars of  
the reallocation of loan funds referred to.
