(1) This is satisfactory. The provision against overlapping between the different rates of freight should present no difficulty.

(2) The suggestion that the special terms should last for five years has not come from the Company and we need not offer so long unless it becomes necessary in the course of negotiation.

(3) (a) I have suggested in the Appendix minute attached to 0000, that we shall have to accept the American's certificate as to present value of sale, I.E.S. Illinois.

(b) As regards future selling price, in 4000 Captain Daniels states that under such conditions, it would be almost impossible for the Company to make a forward contract. I still think that the only possible arrangement is for the freights previously contemplated.
