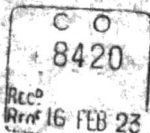

Your telegram of 29th November local allowance I recommend the following revised scale 20 per cent on first £400 of ... 10 per cent on next £200 and 5 on remainder.

[Fixed 15 per cent on House allowance and ^{General duty} (?) allowances (for such as [?] Editor of the Gazette) immigration officer etcetera.]

Allowance attached to individual posts such as Governor's duty allowance to be considered as salary for the purpose of local allowance. I understand that the above scale in case of Tanganyika Territory would exceed 15 per cent average by about 6,000 pounds sterling but in the case of Uganda and Kenya it will fall within that average.
