Telegram from the Officer Administering the Government of the East Africa Protectorate to the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

Dated 4th May, 1920.

(Received Colonial Office 8.30 p.m. 5th May, 1920).

237 May 4th your telegram 21st April alien missionaries following in Protectorate licensed to remain at places named under former enemy alien restriction ordinance 23 of 1919 Brother Godfrey Leykauf White Fathers Mombasa, Brothers Martial Meleraud Killian Rettig Saint Asmetins Roman Catholic Mission Kyambet under no restrictions otherwise. No nuns. Application from Roman Catholic nuns about to be deported from German East Africa to enter and reside in East Africa Protectorate refused. Alsatian missionaries Schoegelen and Weigel interned India refused permission to return to East Africa Protectorate owing to their active participation in enemy side during war.
