

286. May 14th. My telegram 1st April No. 170  
native hut poll tax bill has been amended in Legislative  
Council<sup>80</sup> to fix maximum rate of both taxes at 10 rupees.  
Actual rates to be fixed by proclamation as may appear  
expedient for different districts. May I assent to  
Ordinance and exercise discretion in issuing proclamation.  
Very necessary there should be no further delay in com-  
mencing collection of tax. Income and land tax bills  
still in committee.


