My Lord,

I have the honour to inform Your Lordship that the Principal Medical Officer has recommended the payment of a fee by any candidate who is examined by a Government Medical Officer with a view to local engagement.

2. Dr. Milne has cited the similar practice prevailing in the case of the Medical Adviser to the Colonial Office and also in the Uganda Protectorate.

3. I incline to the opinion that such examination might well be considered as within the scope of the duties of a salaried Medical Officer in the same way as officials in other Departments are called upon to interview applicants for specific vacancies.
