I have the honour to transmit, for Your Lordship's consideration, a copy of a memorandum which has been addressed to the Treasurer by the Chief Paymaster, East Africa Pay Corps, on the subject of the enforcement of the provisions of Section 13 in "The Military Labour Corps Distribution of Pay and Personal Property Ordinance" No. XXXV of the year 1918.

2. I am aware from Your Lordship's despatch No. 136 of the 20th February, 1919, that His Majesty the King was not advised to exercise his power of disallowance with reference to the measure in question, but as attention has been drawn to the necessity for definite sanction from the Army Council and the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury to the disposal of these funds, I consider it advisable

Reference your No. 622/1/2 dated 5th August 1920, forwarding copy of a memo No. 818/4.50/2 dated 28/7/20 from the Chief Native Commissioner.

1. I have no authority to transfer the undernoted amounts to the Chairman of the Central Board, and until I receive a copy of the authority from the Army Council in this respect, the balances in question must stand to the credit of Army Pay.

2. All unclaimed balances, after a certain period, should revert to the British public in accordance with Army Regulations.

3. I have therefore to request that the matter may be referred to the Secretary of State for the Colonies for the information of the Army Council who will, no doubt, refer the matter to the Lords Commissioners of Treasury, in London, for decision.
