Mr. Bottomley

Mr. Stewart Stockman when he called last night said that he knew of some suitable candidates now available for the post of Stock Inspector for which generally it is very difficult to find candidates. I understood that some of these men had been temporarily employed under him so that he could personally recommend them. They have expressed themselves as ready to go wherever out of course it is impossible to say whether they would definitely be willing to go until the actual offer of employment is made to them.

So far as I know there are no vacancies at present in Kenya; there are some in Uganda but the Governor has expressed himself as able to obtain candidates locally. If it is possible to get good ones locally it is of course desirable to do so, but I do not see any harm in telegraphing to the Governor of Uganda in draft form.

I understand that there are two or three vacancies in Tanganyika and I have accordingly passed on the information to Mr. Macdonald. I have also sent a note to the same effect to the Private Secretary and the Crown Agents.
